Statler, Waldorf and the Muppets Troupe

What exactly is Statler and Waldorf's connection to the Muppets?

You could tell me they're two old men who go to and hate every show, but I'm honestly wondering. Are they actually a part of the troupe themselves, playing two old men who go to and hate every show? In canon, I mean, not "Well, they ARE Muppet characters" I mean in the universe of The Muppets, are they part of the troupe.

They have been on stage a few times in The Muppet Show, played parts in the movies and specials that were adaptations of things (a major part in Christmas Carol), make real life appearances to promote Muppet related stuff, and, the most damning of all, were in the crowd of despondent Muppets when Kermit was giving his rousing speech after the telethon went under. The fact that Statler and Waldorf are in the movies at all, since we're supposed to see the Muppets as actors making a movie, makes me think they're actually all part of the show. If there were two geezers who came to every performance I put on and hated them, I sure as hell wouldn't let them in my movie!

So what do you guys think? All part of the show, or am I just overthinking it?

You're totally overthinking it, which is more than okay.

I always assumed that they weren't part of the troupe during the Muppet Show days. The movies (with the exception of the newest one) didn't seem to take place in the same universe, so I saw them as actors, just like the rest of the Muppets (which I guess makes them part of a "troupe" just as much as the collection of inanimate puppets in the Workshop make up the cast).

But then there was the Muppet Show Comic Book where Statler and Waldorf disappear and Kermit gets all worried because they're curmudgeonly, but still part of the family. Which, I guess would make them a part of the troupe, but only after years of attending the show.

Anyway, now I'm overthinking it. And that's okay.

I always felt that Statler and Waldorf were retired vaudevillian performers who held some sort of arrangement with the J.P. Grosse and Muppet Theatre and had way too much idle time on their hands. That they're a part of the group peripherally. Maybe even benefactors. But that's just my fiction.

That's always been in my head as well. They were old performers from the theatre's early days, who retain a box because of their connection to the place. They miss the old days and aren't sure what to make of the new kids and their weird acts, but at the same time they hold a fondness to them that keeps them coming back.

Mike C

There are times when they actually do connect to the Muppets' numbers. Once when Fozzie sang "Wotcher Knocked 'Em in the Old Kent Road." Another time when Piggy sang "My Old Man." That speaks to the era of music that they appreciate.

You also have to factor in that they're natural born critics, and they themselves feel like they'd be nothing without something to criticize. The Muppets are just convenient targets. A characterization that's stayed with them even in their modern incarnations is that they on occasion point out the flaws in their own judgement. My favorite line has always been:

Statler: They just don't make the old songs anymore.

Waldorf: No, they only make new ones.

I think that speaks a lot to their relationship to the show: They seek to understand it but are too set in their old ways to appreciate it. The frequent visits to the Muppet show have become part of their habitual routine as a strange way of affirming their relevance, and the Muppets are just wary enough to make it worth it for them.

Ryan R

Statler and Waldorf can't help themselves from heckling The Muppet Show because they're old and cranky, but they must have some affection for the Muppets. So they follow them around like groupies, and every time they tape a new special or movie, Kermit sees them hanging around the set and gives them a part onscreen.

Peter Savieri

I've always seen the Muppets as primarily FAMILY and secondarily TROUPE. It's like Kermit's nurturing and friendly nature, and desire to "make millions of people happy" has attracted this band of misfits and once they're all together, they need a purpose in life and a way to make a meagre living. They really only have two viable choices... 1) rent themselves out as sponges and dish-cloths or 2) put on a puppet show.

My feeling is that Statler and Waldorf are attracted to the group because of this family aspect. They're lonely old Muppets who would otherwise be retired and telling half-distracted jokes and half-remembered stories of the good old days by a fire in a retirement lodge someplace (as in Sex and

Violence). They find purpose in abusing the Muppets, which is actually just to mask that they actually relish the company.

Just as in most families, they're the members that are loved in a broad sense but who communicate that love through antagonism. They won't ever leave because they've found the place they belong, but they won't ever stop ragging on the other Muppets either, because that gives them a sense of pride and superiority, and saves them from feeling washed up.

So I guess by my appraisal they're part of the Muppet family, but they're in opposition to the Muppet troupe. They belong, but as a counterpoint.

Thinking about Mat's question within the narrative universe -- are they Muppet-troupe "actors" playing Statler and Waldorf, or are they really just curmudgeons who heckle the show -- I've always thought of them as "real" rather than "actors".

Nobody's given them a script and told them what to say; they just show up and interrupt. Even in "The Muppets" when they've got an exposition-driven scene, I think they're just showing up and making jokes -- and if that happens to be plot-exposition, then they'll make fun of that too.



He says, "I did The Muppets... after I did the first James Bond movie, and they said, 'We'd like you to be on the show. Do you sing or dance?' and I said, 'No, but I used to do a fire eating act...' and so we incorporated this into the show... I blew fire."

The rehearsal went well but then a prop master suggested he try the scene again with a different fuel, and Brosnan was left with a scorched mouth.



"Bert and Ernie are best friends. They were created to teach preschoolers that people can be good friends with those who are very different from themselves. Even though they are identified as male characters and possess many human traits and characteristics... they remain puppets, and do not have a sexual orientation."

While yes, they say they are puppets, I've always felt that they cover the fact that they are simply best friends and not gay. To me, the puppets comment is to detail how ridiculous it is that they keep having to defend it.

Of course, being brothers wouldn't preclude them from also being gay (I have two gay brothers myself), but one hopes it would prevent them from being a couple.

With that said, given the relative paucity of positive gay role models on television, I completely understand why LGBT individuals, couples, etc. would identify with Bert and Ernie. And while I try to be respectful of that interpretation, whenever I see something like that New Yorker cover, all I can think is, "Puppet incest! Ugh, creepy!

So when the Workshop says things like, "They're puppets that don't have a sexual orientation," I think what they're trying to say, albeit in an awkward and confusing way, is that they don't want to invalidate any individual interpretations. Granted, it would be more helpful if they would just say that, but even that could get twisted unrecognizably in the media, so I'm willing to cut them a little slack.

I would like to concur that the phrases of "they are just puppets" is very disingenuous.

Whereas, the human characters can and do represent that. Hence those characters having relationships, marriages, families, etc.

It would be very powerful for Sesame to have some human relationships that represent more types of families, rather than avoiding the question year after year. If that happened, perhaps people would stop picking on these two felted characters with whom they happen to identify.

Mary A

I disagree that saying "they are puppets that do not have a sexual orientation" is disingenuous. I think it was an ineffective rhetorical choice, but it is the literal truth: Bert and Ernie are puppets, puppets are inanimate objects, and inanimate objects do not have sexual orientation. I think part of the confusion comes from the habit of using the words "puppet" and "character" interchangeably. Puppets, being inanimate objects, do not have sexual orientation. Characters, on the other hand, DO have sexual orientation, although the audience does not always need to be aware of what that orientation might be.

Instead of saying "Bert and Ernie are puppets that do not have a sexual orientation," I wish they had said, "Like approximately 1% of the population, Bert and Ernie's sexual orientation is asexual." Then they could explain how asexuality is a normal, but rare and often misunderstood, variant of human sexuality, and that there are people in the world--real live human beings who exist below the waist and everything--who identify as asexual.

I don't know if that would be more effective or seem less disingenuous, but at least it would be educational.





Basically what I want to spark you all to do is look back on your experiences with Muppet or Creature Shop or any other Henson creations, and find those weird nebulous childhood impressions when you felt an odd spark of something from a character.

Now I'm not implying, or even hoping, that we all m******** d furiously to the Muppets. That thought grosses even ME out! I'm talking about those moments when something odd fires in your childhood brain, that doesn't yet have a context, but hints at a mysterious world.

Jareth's crotch in Labyrinth would be a perfect example if he was a puppet character, but as far as I know even his crotch was 100% Bowie, so a better example might be Lydia the Tattooed Lady or Hans My Hedgehog when he turns from animal to man (this fitting because he is played in part through puppetry/costume).

The connections between our childhood and adult selves are absolutely fascinating to me, and vital to us understanding ourselves and each other, so this sort of exploration can really unite the continuum of our formative years, I think. So as funny or weird as it may seem, I'd love to really go somewhere with this thread.

To an asylum, most likely...

I'll start with 3 realisations of my own (none of which, amazingly, involve Miss Piggy). They're all, coincidentally, from The Dark Crystal:






