



#### Letters to Santa: A Muppets Christmas

- Anthony And now I watched the clip. It looks like it could be fun. I liked the song. That said, I'm still having a hard time adjusting to the "Muppets are just regular people who hang out in the real-world all the time" vibe seems to have become the standard over the last decade.
- **Scott** Haven't they been that way since 1979?
- **Anthony** No, not really. The movies were the exception in those days. The old specials take place in fantasy Muppet worlds.

Look at Muppet Family Christmas - Doc's a human in a Muppet world there, not the other way around. The Muppets Go to the Movies, A Celebration of 30 Years and others take place in theaters, a Muppet's natural home.

More importantly, they acted like The Muppets in all of those things, including the movies. They were entertainers always, regardless of where they were. They told corny jokes, put on memorable production numbers, and did vaudevillian dialogue.

Since Muppets from Space, we've gotten this ordinary world where they don't really do any of that. They just act like regular people who live in a house somewhere.

Two examples - First, the two adaptations from the 90s were just that. Adaptations. They cast the Muppets in other roles, but at least we could pretend they acted like The Muppets when the sketch was over. In Oz, we see what they do in their free time, and it's . . . drive around the country looking for humans to star in Muppet productions?! Not guest-stars. Just regular humans, because the Muppets have become more and more like regular humans.

Second - One big reason that the Muppet Theatre stuff in It's a Very Merry Muppet Christmas Movie doesn't work for me is that no one acts like they're in the Muppet Theatre. They act like regular performers who are sitting around waiting to go on. On The Muppet Show, they did the same type of jokes backstage that they did on-stage. Of course, in VMC they don't even do Muppety stuff when they're on-stage, so I guess it's too much to ask that they do it backstage.

In this preview, we don't see anything that resembles wacky, Muppety fun. We get Kermit, Fozzie, Gonzo, and Piggy waiting in line at the post office doing expository dialogue like they're on some sitcom. They aren't doing anything funny or even especially interesting. They're just standing around waiting like boring, dull, average human beings. I like to think that Muppets don't do mundane, everyday things. In their movies they have adventures, sure. They ride bicycles, they dance on stage, they drive buses full of Muppets to Hollywood. On their TV show, they entertain. But they certainly don't brush their teeth or wait in line at the post office. And if they do, it's a set-up for a joke or a song or a nice character moment. It's a device to make millions of people happy. It isn't an obligation that they have in their personal lives.

It's no fun.

And yes, I realize that there is a song in that clip. As I mentioned earlier, I liked it. It's a step in the right direction. But why can't they act like Muppets before it starts?

Joe See, I like the Muppets-in-the-real-world vibe. That's why MTM is my favorite Muppet movie. I'm a little tired of Muppets Under Water and Muppets in the Wild West.

Also, I like how the air conditioning ducts are connected to the mail system. That explains why I never get my packages.

**Anthony** Heh. I like it too, when they do funny and/or touching and/or interesting things. I like Muppets in the real world, but I don't like Muppets acting like humans.

Somehow I can't see this modern-day version of The Muppets all getting funny jobs to write to Kermit about. They'd all still be waiting for the bus and doing exposition.

Okay, I'm done now.

- Jamie B Some astute observations that made me laugh a lot some definite truths in there. They do seem to have acquired the weight of the world since MFS in their film work, and it's just not necessary. I think now the gang is back together (recasts settling in) there's no reason we shouldn't start feeling more of a troupe mentality start kicking in again. A little bit of an infectious desire to outperform each other and just put on a show would be wonderful (without theaters being in danger or the need to mope over breakfast cereal.)
- **Daniel** Those are some really great points. I think what happened is that the writers have been unsure with what to do with the characters, because in there minds, without the Muppet Show, they aren't performers anymore. For me, what's been lost is a good sense of context. Why are the Muppets together when not in the context of the Muppet Show? The first three movies had context. We have an origin of the characters from the Muppet Show. Next they are putting on a heist movie, followed by being together because they went to college and are taking the show to broadway. That's kind of the beginning of what we have now, but still performing. This is followed by being

performers in adaptations credited along side regular actors, much like Caper but with unoriginal stories.

Then comes Muppets from Space. What do they do? Nothing that we know of. They just live in a house together. We don't even know why, they just do. All we know is that they are Muppets, so they must. Miss Piggy seems to be the only one with a job and it's getting coffee. Nobody else has any kind of development or context for being. ## What did you think of Letters to Santa?

Yossi I didn't really like it at all. For a bunch of reasons, but here's the main reason: The Kermit, Fozzie, and Gonzo that I know from TMS are all very selfabsorbed people. Having them drop everything on a meaningless favor that doesn't directly benefit any of them is completely out of character.

# Michal Self-absorbed? Really?

I mean, they're absorbed in making sure the show goes on, or getting a laugh, or enthusiasm for absurdity, but they're not selfish characters.

They're not entirely selfless, either. But as long as you're comparing this scenario to that of TMS, keep in mind they don't have a show at stake here. They just have their vacations, which do seem a rather boring thing to drop just to deliver Claire's letter.

If the same characters were putting on The Muppet Show, would they drop a performance to deliver letters to Santa? No, they would bring the show with them to the North Pole or to Claire's apartment, or something equally large-scale, which might have been more exciting.

**Yossi** Gonzo and Fozzie were all about practicing their art, and never mind actually providing the (fictional) audience with any actual entertainment.

And Kermit was all about keeping the show running as smoothly as possible, and never mind whose feelings he had to risk hurting along the way.

(I mean, if you asked any of \*them\*, they wouldn't admit it. They don't \*know\* they're self-absorbed. But that doesn't mean they aren't. Most people don't really internalize how self-absorbed they are. I certainly don't.)

It's like I said in a post a few days ago -- it's only really the Muppets unless somebody's behavior is completely exasperating somebody else. Fozzie and Gonzo should have been exasperating, and Kermit should have been exasperated. The only person being exasperated in this special was Piggy, and she was swept offstage as rapidly as possible.

- MichalWell, now you're just asking for lots and lots of non-exasperating, yetMuppety, examples to disproves your rule.
- **Yossi** Bring it on.

I'll bet all of them work only because they're built on a foundation of exasperated-ness. The peaceful, fuzzy, satisfying resolution to a comedic conflict.

Either that, or they're song and dance numbers whose appeal is in the spectacle, slapstick comedy, and/or wordplay. But those aren't really Muppety things in and of themselves; they're just things that the Muppets happen to do well.

**David B** Yossi hit the nail on the head of part of my argument, and I cannot hold my tongue any longer. I've been thinking how to best compose this since watching the special, and this is what I've come up with.

Yossi is right that most of the characters are now bland and sterile. Gonzo especially. He used to have an edge of danger about him, a lunatic bravado that made you feel that you should never be in the passenger seat while he's driving. The muted Sad Sack we were subjected to is unrecognizable and not true to the character's roots. Even when Gonzo was depressed (and albeit ugly) in the first season of TMS, he was still batshit crazy, and endearingly so. This Gonzo would seem more at home drinking cocoa by the fire than defusing a bomb while reciting Percy Bysshe Shelley.

And Kermit has essentially just become a guardian for the rest of the characters, with little discernible character of his own. Gone is the snark that Jim's Kermit so gloriously had - Steve's Kermit is gooey and placating to a fault. Yes, Kermit was often the peacemaker and the level-headed one, but he had a wit and a recurring frazzled-ness that rounded him out. Kermit, in recent times, has become an emblem and less a character, and the poorer for it. And the reworking of these two characters is indicative of the overall neutering of the Muppets.

. . .

My favorite things about the special are things that even the schmaltziest of writers could not kill - the madcap cameos of characters like Crazy Harry and Lew Zealand (who are, perverted as they are, probably impossible to sterilize), and the occasional reverent nods to history (the airport bit, Luncheon Counter Monster, Pops). But as a whole, this special kept me at arm's length due to its obvious pandering for sympathy and lack of the zest that made the Muppets appealing in the first place.

We need to get Season Four of The Muppet Show, post haste. That's my Muppets. And I fear those Muppets are no longer with us.

**Yossi** I don't think it's even a question. Those Muppets are indeed no longer with us.

But I suspect that now somebody who agrees with the points that we made will sidle up to the forum and (as people sometimes do) post something along the lines of "well, maybe if they aren't going to do it right, nobody should make any new Muppet stuff anymore." But I certainly wouldn't want that. I just want new Muppet stuff that's truer to the existing Muppet stuff that I actually like. Possibly the best way to achieve that is to ignore everything that's been made since, say, 1986, and look at the movies, series, specials, and sketches from before that time, and wonder okay, how do I make more of this -- but for a modern audience?

It sounds like maybe that's what Jason Segel is trying to do, since he possibly isn't actually \*familiar\* with any of the post-1986 stuff. (Does anybody know if that movie is likely to actually get made? We haven't heard anything about it in a few months.)

(And I know -- such an approach would undo twenty years of character development, but in this case, I don't think that would be a bad thing. I'd have to hope that the performers could handle it if the writers and directors could. After all, actors portray earlier versions of characters in flashbacks all the time.)

**Yossi** In GMC, Fozzie wasn't Fozzie, he was a Fozzie-like character in an adventure story, as portrayed by Fozzie. (If you catch my drift.) All of the in-movie versions of the characters needed more nobility than their ordinary selves have to make the movie's story work.

I don't remember Kermit being sick in enough detail to dispute that one -- but the Harry Belafonte episode depicted Fozzie's egoism in full force.

"And well all know who we have to thank for that!"

"The script-writer!"

"No... the guest star, Fozzie."

Like most people, Fozzie has a deep, dark, interior. His passion for being the center of attention and for creative expression results in his wanting as much control over the show as he can possibly grab. At the same time, he really wants people to like him.

Those goals are mutually contradictory, which is why he's never yet tried to usurp Kermit and take over the whole shootin'-match, except in the limited ways you mentioned. It's that struggle between his hunger for attention and his vulnerability, coupled with his charming incompetence, that most define his character.

(And to think Frank Oz once described him as one-dimensional.)

(Though at the same time, the stuff I just said sounds a lot like the stuff other people have been saying about Piggy in other threads. Hmm...)

**Mike C** Well...I really can't complain much about the special. I mean, I owe it some credit for snapping me out of a Muppet-free existence that began just after

"Muppets Wizard of Oz." But it wasn't the best Muppet production I've seen, not even by modern standards. It was good though. I especially liked the scene with Pepe and the Sopranos, and the chemistry between Nathan Lane and Bobo. But I agree with the fact that now not every character is having their own personal funny moment. The one who came closest was actually Kermit, who after an argument with Piggy got the most dramatic facesquishing of Steve Whitmire's career. However, any attempts to do a Muppet mob scene was muted, it's a crime to have Paul Williams directing the Electric Mayhem with no song cue, and it was odd to have Pepe and Rizzo denying Santa Claus and go along to the North Pole while dozens of Muppets who DID believe went on to the Bahamas anyway. There was just too big a plot to cram into an hour, which is a shame, because Kirk Thatcher did much more with VMX, and that one was only a half-hour longer.

**David S** I don't understand how Kermit should be self absorbed?
