Woman Dies Following 'Passion' Screening

Wednesday, February 25, 2004

WICHITA, Kan. – A woman collapsed Wednesday during a screening of The Passion of the Christ and later died at a hospital.

The Wichita Eagle identified the woman as Peggy Law Scott, 57. No cause of death was immediately available.

Scott was attending a 9:30am showing of the movie with some coworkers from Clear Channel Radio when she collapsed about 20 minutes before the end of the movie.

KAKE-TV, which was filming a story on local reactions to the film, reported that Scott collapsed during the film's bloody crucifixion scene.

Two medical professionals who were at the movie tried to revive Scott, said Ken Crockett, a spokesman for Warren Theatres.

Emergency dispatchers said they responded to a report of a woman who wasn't breathing and might be having a seizure.

An autopsy will be conducted on Thursday, according to a spokeswoman for Sedgwick County.

Technically, this wasn't pre-VCR days, but like I said, I was in the extreme country, and we were lucky to have electricity, so although I could record the eps with a tape recorder held up to the speaker, I struggled to read the performer credits at the end.

All I knew about Muppets I had gleaned from my copy of Of Muppets and Men, which as you all know doesn't include Fraggle Rock. So, in my secluded, isolated, Muppet-fan head, I decided the only way to get hold of any information about Fraggles was to write to this local network affiliate. "Dear Channel 6, can you please help me with a detailed cast list?" Oh, and I threw in something about Sam & Friends as well, because, I figured, everybody who worked in TV must know everything about TV. And would have nothing better to do than share their wealth of international and historical television knowledge with 10-year-olds.

The only thing I can remember from the reply letter I got is this sentence: "We regret we can't help you with the early Henson material you mentioned."

(This was the same year I wrote a letter to Santa asking him to get rid of my cold. Weird. Weird kid.)

Michal

These stories all seem to show that Muppets turn children into budding puppeteers and puppet-builders. Not so myself and my sister! We turned into budding drummers.

By "budding," I only mean that we'd stomp around the house chanting, "BU-DDY-RICH! BU-DDY-RICH!" and then tap out sound effects on various household objects. My parents soon followed suit.

I think it's the only reason that I resolved to someday take drum lessons. The only reason I finally followed through is that my drum teacher is a very attractive man okey.

Quinn

I was Muppet Show deprived; for the longest time we couldn't pick up the station that broadcast TMS. When they finally boosted their signal, it turns out it was on opposite 60 Minutes, and owning only one television meant that Professor Rollins got to watch what he wanted, and we languished in Muppetless agony.

Kynan

At the age of maybe 16 or 17, I was outside playing with my sister when all three of my brothers came tearing out of the house. "It's on TV!" "Come look!" "The chickens! The chickens!" They all but dragged me into the lounge, where the opening credits of The Ghost of Faffner Hall were still playing.

"It's got the chickens from The Muppet Show!" my brothers yelled. And you know what? God bless 'em, it did.

Danny

I taped Muppet Shows with a tape recorder up to the speaker. I'm sure lots of people did, that was the VCR of the 70's. I transcribed episodes and songs, and bugged my family by listening to the episodes over and over.

I remember the first episode that I taped – Ben Vereen. From then on, I taped every episode, often stealing my dad's classical tapes to tape over them. (I was seven. My parents didn't buy me tapes. What else was I supposed to do?)

I even tried to make mix tapes of songs and Pigs in Space sketches, by holding up one tape recorder to another. (The results were unearthly. I listened to 'em anyway.)

I learned how to use the write-protection tabs on cassettes the hard way. I'd taped the Bob Hope episode, and I wanted to play my favorite part for someone. (Which was Animal screaming "BUN-NY RAB-BIT, BUN-NY RAB-BIT!" Natch.) I accidentally pressed Record/Play instead of Play. No sound. By the time I figured out why, I'd taped over my favorite part. Sad, really. Since then, I was a demon about the write-protection tabs.

Luckily, my dad apparently never figured out the write-protection thing. (See: stealing his tapes and taping over them.)

Patrick

I used to do this too. However, we didn't have a cassette tape player until about 1983. Anything we taped prior to that was on 8-track! Eeeek! The only 8-track Muppet Show I can remember taping now was the Alan Arkin episode. I specifically remember Fozzie and Rowlf singing "I Got Rhythm." Loved it. We also taped Mary Poppins onto 8-track. Most of it fit, too!

Once the Muppet Show reruns started up on TNT in 88-89, I was using cassette tapes by then. I would only tape the Electric Mayhem songs though.

Thijs

I made Sesame Street comics with my brother, starring Sesame Street characters, Sesamstraat characters (the humans too!), Muppets and "imaginary" characters.

We also recorded "The Sesame Mega Show" with an old tape recorder, with the same characters. (They all sounded the same.)

Nate

On my registration for first grade, I saw a Muppet Show lunchbox in what was the lost and found. I didn't understand why it was in a big box of mittens, books, and junk, and I wanted my mom to buy it. She said she couldn't buy it, but I begged her. So she stole it from me. I have it to this day.

I got a walkman for my birthday one year, shortly after seeing The Muppet Show Live and The Ice Capades. I got my Fraggle Rock cassette out, popped it in, put on my roller skates, and my own Fraggle Rock Live out on our big patio in the backyard. This was the first of many weeks spent working out dance numbers for the live touring shows of Jim Henson's creations.

Jog

My favorite game was playing Muppet Show. I built Muppet theaters with blocks, added Playmobil and Smurf accessories and put on shows with my PVC's. I had four Schleich figures (Kermit, Piggy, Rowlf, Animal) and two Comics Spains (Fozzie, Animal). No Gonzo, but an extra Animal. That extra Animal became Byke, a Telly-like stagehand who'd do everything wrong.

Gonzo was still very, very missing. Occasionally I would play with the Schleich Muppet Babies, because I had all six of them, including Gonzo. But what good is a Muppet Show with Muppet Babies?

Eventually I did get my Gonzo... but the big problem began when I had a Waldorf, but no Statler. By the time I finally found Statler, I was too old for playing this game.

Dan

One of my favorite Muppet merchandise things when I was little was the Muppet Shrinky Dinks. I used to make Piggy have an affair with the Newsman. The second one was The Great Muppet Caper board game. I don't think I ever played the game the way it was supposed to be played, but it made a great set for the Shrinky Dinks.

Another memory that I have is when I was six, telling a friend that Big Bird lived in my attic. He believed this for a number of months. But when I showed him that he didn't, he was pretty pissed off.

Kynan I used to make Piggy have an affair with the Newsman.

I imagine he would be brisk, yet efficient.

Danny And afterwards, things would fall on his head.

Ryan R Here's another thing I did.

You know how the book "Muppet Madness" has a menu for a Swedish Chef-run restaurant? My copy of the book was used and well-worn, so all the pages were falling out. I would pull out that page and play Swedish Chef's restaurant with my parents and the occasional babysitter.

I'd be the waiter, and come in and give them the menu. When they ordered, I'd go to the kitchen and, using the foods that I was allowed to mess with, try to whip up something that resembled the thing they had ordered.

This was not easy when the menu had items like Rübber Bööt Stew, or whatever, so my customers would never really eat any of my food. I can't blame them. I think I may have gotten paid a few times... but it was Swedish currency, so it was no good to me.

Danny I don't think any of my childhood Muppet games involved other people. My family would never have put up with it.

So I had to save it all up for being an adult. Good thing there's an internet.

Ryan R Have you ever played Swedish Chef restaurant as an adult?

Danny I play it every chance I get. What would you like?

Shawn

I just got back from my nephew's birthday dinner. He's six now, and his choice of restaurant was Bugaboo Creek. The family meets up, and we sit down.

I'd like to point out that my nephew is, currently, one of my best friends. He's smart, creative, VERY energetic (some might call him hyper) and INCREDIBLY funny. He always trots something out that makes me howl with laughter. Of course we sit next to each other. (Do I have to mention I'm the favorite "cool uncle"?)

We start doodling on a placemat with crayons the restaurant provides, and he tells me what he wants me to draw. I ask him, does he like Kermit the Frog? And his response is to bust out a really good impression of Piggy's "Step AWAY from the frog!" using a cup as an improv bullhorn. Jessica Simpson is referred to as "Some Lady." He likes the Muppet gang.

I ask, do you like Sesame Street? No, that's for babies. Elmo is for babies. But what about the others? Big Bird? In his best Big Bird voice: "Big Bird should say, 'Hi, Elmo! Would you like to come put your head in the toilet so I can give you a swirlie?'" Tsk's from mom, much laughter from me.

He got the child-portion spareribs for dinner, and the waitress is smart enough to ensure he has plenty of handi-wipes. I remark, you sure have enough wipes. "Yeah," he responds, "and you're one of them." Six years old, ladies and germs.





Octavius and Peter's lecturer are close friends. Octavius blows up the city and turns into a psychotic eight-limbed madman. Peter's lecturer patently doesn't give a damn. He's pleased that Peter's grades improve, though.

Peter gives up being Spider-Man. With, it would seem, no real consequences. There's a supremely silly musical montage, some stuff happens. Aunt May gives him a four-hour speech and Uncle Ben shows up in a dream. And then he's Spider-Man again. Hey, bingo. The Spider-Man no longer plot could really have been something. But here, it's really nothing.

Oh, and there's some thing where Jonah Jameson nearly changes his mind about Spider-Man being a menace, but then doesn't.

Also, Jonah's son/Mary-Jane's fiance is an astronaut. Probably because he was an astronaut in the comic.

There's more. But it really doesn't matter. Because

5. The "Save My Baby" Woman is back. This time with a husband.

Spidey's gotta save the WORLD'S BIGGEST STUNT BABY from a burning building. This is a seriously big bundle of not-baby-looking blankets. The kid might well be played by Gary Coleman. And it's just as well, because when Spidey falls, the kid reaches down and helps him up. And then he takes the MASSIVE BUNDLE OF STUNT BABY and gives it back to the parents, who are waiting outside. They are apparently oblivious to the social rule that suggests, "Before running out of a burning building, why not take your children with you, rather than standing round outside, later on, hoping a superhero will pass by?"
