Special thanks to everyone who nominated posts, as well as everyone who posted on the forum in 2017!



But if you put it on a sandwich...



A version of it with similar behind-the-scenes goings-on, but with generally more friendly Muppets, and more glimpses of onstage acts, would have come closer to hitting the sweet spot.

Dan!, Esq.

Totally. I don't think the show was a failure, but I think the talk show premise might be? Purposely forming it as a question there. I think having the show within a show being anchored to a talking head desk did a disservice to the characters, though really, they didn't really bother explore the Up Late all that much. I think a blend of old and new bits, old being Vet's Hospital and Pigs in Space, not redo's (though a nice novelty to bring back) and new bits would be stellar.

I think my thing with the show in the theater is that it doesn't really have to be acknowledged as a tv variety show, but as a show about an off-broadway troupe and their theatre. It's not really doing the Muppet Show again and again if the material is what changes. It's just the framing and location that is the same. Show us the place from different angles, give us more an idea of the space. I'd like that the 2015 series has character driven plots. Maybe instead of working two or three of those into each show, maybe a general behind the scenes plot, one character plot (or combo of those two), and at least one sketch. Oh, and a musical number. Perhaps a full or extended version for the web.

Jes

I disagree that the show within a show part was the problem. If they had done more with the Up Late portion, instead of focusing on the backstage drama, I think it would have been a winner. At least for the first couple seasons, they should have brought in more zany stuff and explored Up Late's format. Then they could have moved more into the personal lives of the crew. Having Fozzie date a woman was too much of a jolt right out of the box.

Dan!, Esq.

I see what you mean there. Maybe that was my problem with it. They didn't really explore the show much at all, and when they did, it was Piggy, talking through scripted content, with her Guest, which isn't really all that fun. Maybe if the interview was ad-libbed or something. But yeah, they just didn't do much with it. Most of the current late night shows are more Muppety than Up Late was ever allowed to be.

Jes

Exactly. They should have brought in acts like a real show... music, comedy, zany animals, etc. Or hey—they could have made Kermit the host... he's more Johnny Carson than Piggy is.

Tom

Wow. As much as I would have loved a straight-up "Up Late with Miss Piggy," I might have liked "Up Late with Kermit the Frog" even more!

Shane

Piggy's the only one in the troupe who's a "star," though. I think it makes total sense that she'd be the one with a show to revolve around here (i.e. The Fantastic Miss Piggy Show).

Jes

True. But classic talk shows don't have a "star" at the helm. Johnny Carson, Merv Griffin, Mike Douglas... all foils for their guests.

Ryan R

I'll give you Mike Douglas and Merv Griffin, but Johnny Carson was absolutely a star.

Also, it would have been fun to see Kermit as the host of Up Late, but if that had happened within a version of The Muppets that had the same format, what would Piggy's role have been? It's difficult to imagine her accepting a part as sidekick, announcer, or any behind-the-scenes job. Kermit was the host of The Muppet Show, but that show was full of onstage acts Piggy could participate in.

Matt Smith

His show was even called The Tonight Show Starring Johnny Carson ... Carson was the star, not just a host. (Leno changed it to "with" instead of starring which fit his hosting style... but Fallon brought back the "starring" which also fits his show/style).

Jes

Johnny was a star talent but he wasn't a "star." His demeanor was more understated, especially in the early years. If they had made Kermit the host, Piggy could have been the headliner for the house band or what if they flipped it totally and made her a crazy business producer/manager who really wished she was still headliner? I'm just saying, there were ways to go.

But was Johnny Carson a star when he took the Tonight Show gig? I know he was an actor and comedian, but I honestly don't know if he was a household name at that point.


